- With great patience, she helped Helen learn how to speak – she allowed her to touch her lips and do lip reading to learn speaking.
- She made learning a game for Helen.
- Helen learnt by discovering things for herself.
- Hence, because of Anne Sullivan Helen acquired knowledge effortlessly.
